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PURPOSE

To provide a clear statement of the safety and wellbeing related requirements and expectations Port Nelson has of its leaders, people, and those who enter our workplace. In addition, the Policy provides a reference point for guiding ongoing continuous improvement.

POLICY

Working together, all Port Nelson people and those that come into our workplace, will provide an environment that has, as a priority, care for the physical and mental, health and wellbeing of our people, customers, contractors, and community.

Together we achieve this by:

- Placing people first and at the heart of our decision-making.
- Building and sustaining a safety culture, reflective of our values, where all who work
 within the port environment are respected and passionately engaged in safety and
 wellbeing.
- Providing our people with the tools, training, support and authority to care for themselves, their workmates and all who come into our workplace.
- Ensuring everyone who comes into the Port Nelson workplace has a voice and is heard.
- Keeping the **conversation about risk alive**, even when the job appears safe.
- Visibly demonstrating leadership's commitment to safety and wellbeing.
- Promoting clarity clear communication and understanding of safety procedures;
 compliance adherence to safety regulations and requirements; and consistency reinforced behaviours supported by our positive safety culture.
- Sustaining a culture and systems that support active continuous improvement.
- Supporting the safe and early return to meaningful work of any port person who suffers an injury or Illness.
- Consulting, co-ordinating and co-operating with contractors and third parties that work at Port Nelson to ensure all work is undertaken safely.

- Being **proactive in identifying workplace risks and hazards** and taking steps to eliminate or minimise these.
- Providing an operating framework that includes health and safety standards, procedures and metrics, which support our policy and objectives.
